Local security guide - Aberfoyle Park SA 5159 - Southern Adelaide, City of Onkaparinga

About Aberfoyle Park

Aberfoyle Park is about 17 km south of the Adelaide CBD.

Aberfoyle Park is a southern Adelaide suburb in the City of Onkaparinga, in the foothills near Happy Valley, with a local shopping centre, schools and reserves. At the 2021 Census, 11,234 people lived in Aberfoyle Park in about 4,167 occupied homes: 94% separate houses, 5% townhouses or semi-detached homes and almost no apartments, and 14% of homes were rented.

Housing and local context

Housing stock: Brick family homes from the 1970s and 1980s on hillside blocks, almost all separate houses.

Aberfoyle Park's hillside streets have brick family homes from the 1970s and 1980s, many split-level with garages below and back yards that can't be seen from the street, and reserves and creek lines running through the suburb.

Common security concerns in Aberfoyle Park

- Original locks in older homes
- Split-level homes with hidden entries
- Homes empty while owners travel

Local tip: Updating locks in an established home

Aberfoyle Park's median age was 42 at the 2021 Census, and many homes have been owned for years with their original locks. Replacing worn deadlocks, adding keyed window locks and fitting a video doorbell are simple upgrades. Consider a monitored alarm if you travel.

Before you hire: checklist

- Look up the licence number on the relevant state regulator register and confirm it is current.
- Check the ABN on the Australian Business Register (abr.business.gov.au).
- Hardwired 240V work needs a licensed electrician; in-wall data cabling needs an ACMA-registered cabler.
- For guards and patrols, confirm both the firm licence and each attending officer's licence.
- Get at least three written quotes listing camera models, recorder storage and warranty.
- Aim cameras at your own property and consider disabling audio on cameras facing shared areas.
