Local security guide - Blacktown NSW 2148 - Western Sydney, City of Blacktown

About Blacktown

Blacktown is about 34 km west of the Sydney CBD.

Blacktown is the commercial centre of Sydney's most populous council area, with Westpoint Blacktown, the Main Street and Flushcombe Road shops, Blacktown Hospital and a busy rail interchange. BOCSAR recorded 4,680 criminal incidents in Blacktown in the year to June 2026 (not counting transport fines and breaches of bail or court orders), close to the 4,649 of the year before. Theft from shops (539) was the largest single group, and there were 102 motor vehicle thefts and 99 break-ins to homes.

Housing and local context

Housing stock: Post-war brick and fibro houses, former Housing Commission homes, townhouses and newer apartments near the station.

Blacktown's residential streets are mostly single-storey brick and fibro houses built from the 1950s to the 1980s, including many former Housing Commission homes, with blocks increasingly split for duplexes, villas and townhouses. Apartments have gone up near the station and the town centre. Cars are usually parked in driveways or on the street, and many homes have a side path to the back yard that can't be seen from the street.

Common security concerns in Blacktown

- Car theft from driveways, often using keys taken from the house
- Theft from shops around Westpoint and the town centre
- Side paths and back yards hidden from the street

Local tip: Keep car keys away from the front door

Modern cars are hard to drive away without their key, so the key is worth protecting. Keep keys out of sight and away from the front door, lock the car and the garage every night, and point a camera with good night vision at the driveway. Blacktown recorded 102 motor vehicle thefts in the year to June 2026.

Before you hire: checklist

- Look up the licence number on the relevant state regulator register and confirm it is current.
- Check the ABN on the Australian Business Register (abr.business.gov.au).
- Hardwired 240V work needs a licensed electrician; in-wall data cabling needs an ACMA-registered cabler.
- For guards and patrols, confirm both the firm licence and each attending officer's licence.
- Get at least three written quotes listing camera models, recorder storage and warranty.
- Aim cameras at your own property and consider disabling audio on cameras facing shared areas.
