Local security guide - Mildura VIC 3500 - Sunraysia, Rural City of Mildura

About Mildura

Mildura is about 540 km north-west of Melbourne.

Mildura is the main centre of the Sunraysia district on the Murray River in Victoria's far north-west, with the Langtree Avenue mall, Mildura Central, Mildura Base Public Hospital, the riverfront and surrounding vineyards and citrus and almond orchards. The Crime Statistics Agency recorded 7,253 offences in Mildura in the year to June 2026, close to the 7,184 of the year before. Breaches of family violence orders (1,019) were the largest group, followed by criminal damage (555), thefts from motor vehicles (503) and theft from shops (483), and there were 231 car thefts.

Housing and local context

Housing stock: Post-war brick and weatherboard homes, 1970s and 1980s brick houses, newer estates, and horticultural and rural-residential blocks around the city.

Mildura's streets have post-war brick and weatherboard homes and 1970s and 1980s brick houses on large blocks, many with carports and open driveways rather than lock-up garages. Newer estates have spread around the city, and horticultural blocks, packing sheds and farms nearby hold machinery, fuel and equipment. Hot summers mean windows and doors are often open in the evening, so screens with proper locks help.

Common security concerns in Mildura

- Theft from cars, utes and trailers
- Car theft
- Property damage to homes, cars and fences

Local tip: Leave nothing in the car or the tray

Mildura recorded 503 thefts from motor vehicles last year, one of the largest offence groups in the city. Lock the car every time, leave nothing on the seats or in the tray, take tools inside overnight, and park in a garage or behind a locked gate where you can. A sensor light and a camera over the driveway help deter anyone trying door handles at night.

Before you hire: checklist

- Look up the licence number on the relevant state regulator register and confirm it is current.
- Check the ABN on the Australian Business Register (abr.business.gov.au).
- Hardwired 240V work needs a licensed electrician; in-wall data cabling needs an ACMA-registered cabler.
- For guards and patrols, confirm both the firm licence and each attending officer's licence.
- Get at least three written quotes listing camera models, recorder storage and warranty.
- Aim cameras at your own property and consider disabling audio on cameras facing shared areas.
