

Mount Druitt Security Report

Local security guide - Mount Druitt NSW 2770 - Western Sydney, City of Blacktown

About Mount Druitt

Mount Druitt is about 43 km west of the Sydney CBD.

Mount Druitt is the main centre of the western part of the City of Blacktown, with Westfield Mount Druitt, the station and bus interchange, Mount Druitt Hospital and a TAFE campus, surrounded by large residential estates. BOCSAR recorded 2,649 criminal incidents in Mount Druitt in the year to June 2026 (not counting transport fines and breaches of bail or court orders), down slightly from 2,712 the year before. Theft from shops (462) was the largest group, followed by intimidation, stalking and harassment (251) and fraud (221), and there were 187 trespass offences.

Housing and local context

Housing stock: Post-war and 1970s brick and fibro houses, former Housing Commission homes, townhouses and newer apartments near the station.

The suburbs around Mount Druitt were built largely as Housing Commission estates in the 1960s and 1970s, and Mount Druitt itself mixes those brick and fibro homes with private housing, townhouses and newer apartments near the station. The town centre is the shopping and service hub for the surrounding suburbs, so the shopping centre, station and nearby streets are busy through the day and into the evening.

Common security concerns in Mount Druitt

- Theft from shops around Westfield Mount Druitt
- Trespass at the back of shops and business premises after hours
- Theft from cars at the station and shopping centre

Local tip: Watch the back of the building

Trespass was unusually common in Mount Druitt last year, with 187 offences, much of it around shops, car parks and business premises after hours. Businesses should cover rear doors, loading bays and staff car parks with cameras that record at night, keep the back of the building lit, and use a monitored alarm with patrol response so someone checks when it goes off.

Before you hire: checklist

- Look up the licence number on the relevant state regulator register and confirm it is current.
- Check the ABN on the Australian Business Register (abr.business.gov.au).
- Hardwired 240V work needs a licensed electrician; in-wall data cabling needs an ACMA-registered cabler.
- For guards and patrols, confirm both the firm licence and each attending officer's licence.
- Get at least three written quotes listing camera models, recorder storage and warranty.
- Aim cameras at your own property and consider disabling audio on cameras facing shared areas.
