Local security guide - St Marys NSW 2760 - Outer west Sydney, City of Penrith

About St Marys

St Marys is about 45 km west of the Sydney CBD.

St Marys sits between Penrith and Mount Druitt in Sydney's outer west, with the Queen Street shops, local shopping centres, the station and interchange, and large industrial estates nearby. BOCSAR recorded 2,071 criminal incidents in St Marys in the year to June 2026 (not counting transport fines and breaches of bail or court orders), up from 1,714 the year before, an increase of about a fifth. Theft from shops (211), intimidation, stalking and harassment (199), fraud (191) and malicious damage (190) were the largest groups, and there were 65 break-ins to homes and 40 to other buildings.

Housing and local context

Housing stock: Brick and fibro houses from the 1950s to the 1970s, former Housing Commission homes, and newer townhouses and apartments near Queen Street.

St Marys is one of Sydney's older western towns, with Queen Street as its traditional main street, and its housing ranges from post-war brick and fibro homes to former Housing Commission estates and newer townhouses and apartments close to the station. Many houses have a detached garage or shed out the back and room for a trailer or work vehicle. Industrial estates nearby hold workshops, warehouses and trade businesses.

Common security concerns in St Marys

- Break-ins to sheds, garages and workshops
- Theft from shops around Queen Street and the shopping centres
- Property damage to cars, fences and shopfronts

Local tip: Secure sheds, garages and workshops

St Marys recorded 40 break-ins to buildings other than homes last year, including sheds, garages and workshops. Tools and equipment are easy to sell, so fit a solid padlock and hasp or a proper shed lock, keep ladders and tools inside, add a wireless alarm sensor or camera to the shed, and record serial numbers. Business units in the nearby industrial estates need monitored alarms.

Before you hire: checklist

- Look up the licence number on the relevant state regulator register and confirm it is current.
- Check the ABN on the Australian Business Register (abr.business.gov.au).
- Hardwired 240V work needs a licensed electrician; in-wall data cabling needs an ACMA-registered cabler.
- For guards and patrols, confirm both the firm licence and each attending officer's licence.
- Get at least three written quotes listing camera models, recorder storage and warranty.
- Aim cameras at your own property and consider disabling audio on cameras facing shared areas.
